1.	<p>Kuala Lumpur City Tour 14:00hrs to 17:30hrs</p> <p>Tour highlights: King Palace – The former residence of the King of Malaysia</p> <p>National Monument – Representing Malaysian soldiers’ struggle and sacrifice during The Emergency. Designer Felix de Weldon cast the Malaysian model in bronze in Italy. The monument is modelled after the Iwo Jima memorial in Washington D.C</p> <p>Independence Square – The site of the nation’s historic Declaration of Independence, the area surrounding the square boasts unique colonial era landmarks such as the Sultan Abdul Samad building, the old Selangor Club with its grassy cricket pitch and St Mary’s Anglican Church (built in 1894)</p> <p>National Mosque – Built in 1965, the first modern post-independence building has a delicate shaped dome-roof.</p> <p>National Museum – Built in 1963, the museum sports a classic Minangkabau-styled roof while the front mural walls have Italian mosaic.</p> <p>Kuala Lumpur City Centre – Without a doubt the face of modern KL, this magnificent centerpiece is topped off by the stainless steel and glass complex of the Twin Towers, one of the world’s tallest buildings at 405 meter</p>	<p align="center">USD 23.00 per pax Or MYR 94.00 per pax</p>
2.	<p>Country Tour Batu Caves 14:00hrs to 17:30hrs</p> <p>Tour highlights: Batu Caves / Hindu Temple – A massive limestone outcrop that lies across the scarred landscape of an old tin mine. It is also the site of yearly Hindu religious festival called Thaipusam. At the base of the outcrop lies a small Hindu shrine displaying various Hindu deities. Walk up the 272 steps of the Cave Temple, and view elaborately painted sculptures of various Hindu gods inside.</p> <p>Royal Selangor Pewter Centre – The world’s renowned makers of fine pewter since 1885. A guided tour of the world’s biggest pewter center will fascinate you as you observe how raw materials are shaped into the most exquisite pewter designs. Marvel at the process casting, molding, hammering, engraving and polishing.</p> <p>Batik Design Centre – Batik or wax painting is an ancient Malaysian art form. Both hand drawn and block printing methods are demonstrated here.
